STUDENT FUND-RAISING ACTIVITIES

Fund-raising activities may be held to raise money for special field trips, transportation, tickets to educational events or other projects that are beyond usual school activities or for charitable purposes or public service. Student organizations, under the supervision of faculty advisors, may, on a voluntary basis, provide public services for profit on or off school premises.

In accordance with State law and District policies, all fund-raising projects:

- 1. Must be approved by the organization's advisor(s) and the building principal. All State-regulated fund-raisers (i.e. raffles) must be approved by the Board of Education. Fund-raising may not proceed until written approval has been received.
- 2. Must not interfere with regular classroom activities.
- 3. May not be used for the purchase of specific classroom resources. Established Parent organizations recognized by the Board of Education may, however, fund-raise for purchases which enhance the overall learning environment of the school.
- 4. May not provide funds for use by individual students. Funds raised to support trips or activities must support all members of the group.
- 5. Must not establish mandatory quotas for product sales or donations. Participation in or donation to any fund-raising activity shall be optional. Under no circumstances will any student be compelled to participate or donate, or be penalized for not participating or donating.
- 6. Which are for sale and consumption within and prior to the instructional day will be expected to make every effort to follow the District's Nutrition Guidelines when determining the items being sold.

Students under the age of 12 shall be permitted to participate in fund-raising activities provided written approval has been obtained from the student's parent/guardian. Students under the age of nine must be physically accompanied by a parent or a person at least 16 years of age when working in a fund-raising activity.

All equipment and/or materials purchased from funds derived from fund-raising shall become the property of the School District of Amery and shall be included in the equipment inventory list of the school. Such equipment must meet established safety standards.

All money shall be handled in accordance with established procedures.
