End of 1st Term for Applied Arts Classes

The end of our 1st term for applied arts, science and social studies classes is *Wednesday, 10/11/23*. Students will be switching to their second term classes following this date.

Parent Conferences

Just a reminder, parent teacher conferences will be held on *Monday*, 10/2/23, from 4:00 to 8:00 p.m., and *Thursday*, 10/5/23, from 1:00 to 8:00 p.m. Conferences provide parents with the one-on-one time they may need to discuss their child's education. This year conferences will be held remotely over the phone or in person. Parents will have to sign up for a time to meet or to receive a call. More information about parent conferences will be e-mailed to parents with links to sign up for times to meet with teachers.

Standards Based Grading

Three years ago we moved from a traditional grading system to a standards based grading system. This allows students to receive a more comprehensive grade for each subject showing how well each student has mastered the essential standards taught in that class this school year. Students will receive multiple grades per class. If you have questions about standards based grading, parent conference nights are a perfect opportunity to talk with teachers, ask questions and provide feedback on grading.

End of 1st Trimester for Math & English Classes

The first trimester ends on *Tuesday*, 11/21/23. Report cards will be processed and mailed home the following week.

Wisconsin Forward Exam

The Forward Exam will be administered in Reading/Language Arts and Math in grades 3 through 8. It will also test science in grades 4, 8 and 10.

This exam will be administered in April of this current school year. More information on this test will be sent to families at a later date.

I hope rest of the school year continues to go as well as it has started. We are proud of how our students are performing at this time. Thank you for your continued support.

WARRIOR WAY: RESPECT RESPONSIBILITY SAFETY

Second Step

We want your child to be successful in school, and that means supporting and encouraging their whole development. While excelling in academic classes is important, students also need skills for learning challenges, making good decisions, handling strong emotions, and getting along with others. This month during Warrior Time we began Second Step® Middle School, a research-based social-emotional learning program designed to improve students' social-emotional skills. Second Step skills and concepts are designed to help students both in and out of school. These include:

• Mindsets and Goals: Students learn how to develop a growth mindset and apply research based goal-setting strategies to their social and academic lives. (September/October)

• Recognizing Bullying and Harassment: Students learn how to recognize bullying and harassment, stand up safely to bullying, and respond appropriately to harassment. (October/November)

• Thoughts, Emotions, and Decisions: Students learn how to recognize strong emotions and unhelpful thoughts, and apply strategies to manage their emotions and reduce stress. (November/December)

• Managing Relationships and Social Conflict: Students learn strategies for developing and maintaining healthy relationships, perspective-taking, and dealing with conflict. (December/January)

Bullying Prevention

Nationwide, bullying peaks during the middle school years, and research indicates that taking proactive steps to address bullying will help reduce occurrences of it in our school. Throughout the month of October and November, your child will be discussing bullying during Warrior Time. The curriculum, Second Step, is designed to support your child in developing the knowledge and skills to help stop bullying. Students will learn how to recognize bullying in various contexts, how to use strategies to stand up safely to bullying, and how to seek help if they or someone they know is being bullied. Here are some key definitions your child will be learning:

• Bullying: intentional physical, verbal, or social aggression. It's often repeated over time and occurs when there's a real or perceived power imbalance.

- Bystander: anyone who's aware that bullying is happening
- Online bullying: the use of technology to harass, threaten, or intimidate another person
- · Physical bullying: hurting someone's body or possessions
- Relational bullying: hurting someone's reputation or relationships, such as by excluding them
- Upstander: someone who stands up for a person being bullied
- · Verbal bullying: saying or writing mean things about someone

We encourage students to report any instances of bullying they witness or experience to you and to trusted adults at our school. We have also provided every student the ability to anonymously report bullying or harassment via a link in their Warrior Time Google Classroom.
