**Registration Deadline:** In order to adequately prepare for enrollments, the registration deadline is Friday, April 3 at 9 pm, without exception.

**Registering Students for Correct Age Group:** Students who are registered for classes outside of their grade level will have registrations cancelled. Check age group specifications carefully.

## **\*\*Online Registration\*\***

For your convenience, you are able to register for summer school courses online in addition to using the paper forms, which are available by request from the ES, IS, and MS school offices.

The benefit to using the online registration system is that you can see what is available immediately, and you are more likely to get the classes and schedule that you want!

Please note: paper forms are sent through inter-office mail and cannot be registered until after the school day. Online registration is far quicker.

**Class Locations:** In June, 4K through 3rd grade classes will meet at the Lien Elementary, and 4th through 8th grade classes will meet at the Middle School. In August, Welcome to 4K and Welcome to K will be at Lien, and K-8 classes will be at the Intermediate school.

**Transportation:** Please note--**bus routes have changed this year. The green route was divided between red and blue.** When you register your child, you need to sign him/her up for a specific pick-up and drop-off location if you desire transportation. Students must be picked up and dropped off at the same location. If you sign your child up for bussing and your plans change on a given day, your child will need a note stating that you will be picking him/her up from school instead of riding the bus. Children being picked up at school by a parent or guardian need to be picked up in their classroom. Children must have a note if they are being picked up by someone other than a parent or guardian. **Meals:** Breakfast and lunch will be available at no charge for summer school.

**Course Fees:** This summer, the Amery School District will be providing for all course supplies, charging no fee to students. Please ensure that students attend all courses for which they register, as supplies are ordered in advance, and there may be a waiting list of students who want to attend.

## Mission Statement:

The purpose of the summer school program in Amery is to provide academic and enrichment opportunities for students during the summer months. The activities in this catalog are for students entering 4K through those who completed eighth grade. Enrichment summer classes are designed for your child to explore many extended curriculum opportunities not available during the regular school year in a fun and casual environment.

## Placement of Students

All students enrolled in the School District of Amery are eligible to participate in summer school. Students with disabilities or other impairments are provided reasonable accommodation based on a documented health plan, individual education plan (IEP) or 504 plan. However, not all services, programs, and supports offered during the regular school year are available at summer school. Parents, who know their children best, may register their children keeping their needs, strengths, and limitations in mind. The goal of the Amery summer school program is to provide the highest quality education to every student. The proper placement of students is essential to this goal.

## Behavior Expectations

The expectations for the behavior of students enrolled in the summer school program mirror those of the school district. We believe in “The Warrior Way.” The expectation is that our students will make the learning environment in summer school a healthy, safe, and caring environment for all students. Students are expected to take responsibility for themselves and for their actions. The core tenets of such behavior are:

Be Safe      Be Respectful      Be Responsible

## Children are expected to demonstrate appropriate behavior at all times.

Students may lose privileges if they engage in inappropriate behavior. Inappropriate behaviors include, but are not exclusive to, abusive language, disruption, defiance, fighting or other physical contact, stealing or damaging property, lying, bullying, and elopement (running away). Students choosing these behaviors will be removed from the summer school environment for the remainder of the day or even from the summer school program permanently.

If a student is removed from the summer school program, they are not allowed to finish the remainder of the day in the Amery Clubhouse program. Students who engage in behavior which results in their removal from the summer school program for the day will be sent home with their parent or guardian.

- Welcome to 4K and Welcome to Kindergarten are 8-12 classes. No additional classes are needed during the June or August sessions.
- Choose 2 two-hour classes when attending from 8 am– 12 pm.
- Register for available classes with seats open first. Only join a waitlist if your child does not have a registered class at that time. Wait list students are not added to classes if they already have a class on their schedule.
- Academic Reading and Math classes run for three weeks in June and two weeks in August. The material is not repeated. Wait lists are not available for August academics due to a shortage of teachers those weeks.
- Do not register for enrichment classes that are held at the same time as academics. The registration program will not register a child for two classes at the same time.
- Pay close attention to the grade level, based on the grade the student just completed, for each course offering. Registrations for incorrect grade levels will be cancelled.
- Please ensure that your child attends each class for which s/he is registered. Supplies are purchased and teaching contracts are offered based on registration. “Drop-outs” and “no-shows” are unnecessary costs to the school district.
- Out-of-district students who are not open-enrolled in Amery may register for enrichment courses from March 30–April 3.
- Students receiving reading intervention services will meet with reading specialists during a portion of their enrichment or math courses, not during their academic reading course.

**Where?**

Unity School Aquatic Center

**Why the New Location?**

- Instructors are Red Cross Certified
- The Unity Aquatic Center will be closed to the public during Amery lessons, providing a safer environment for our students

**When?**

One two-week session is offered this year, as other dates were not available.

- August 3-6, Monday-Thursday and August 10-13, Monday-Thursday
  - Students will meet with swim leaders in the Intermediate school gym at 12:00 after morning summer school classes.
  - Students not attending summer school classes will be brought by parents to the IS gym for attendance no later than 12:10.
  - Buses will depart from Amery Intermediate School at 12:15.
  - Group 1 will have lessons from 1:00-1:45. Group 2's lessons will be 1:45-2:30.
  - Buses will depart from Unity School at 2:40.
  - Pick up time ~3:10 pm. Parents should park in the Intermediate or Intermediate parking lot or the lot between the MS and IS. Buses will use the Intermediate bus loop. **Note: Supervision is not available after 3:15. Please be prompt in picking up swimmers in order to continue to benefit from bus service.**

**Cost?**

- \$40.75 per swimmer
  - Includes discounted cost of eight lessons, transportation, supervision, and \$.75 credit card service fee upon registration.
  - Refunds are not available, as payment will be made to Unity School upon registration.

# Swim Lesson Levels

7

## **Level 1- Introduction to Water Skills**

### **Age 6 and up**

Basic swim skills and safety skills will be performed with assistance in the big pool. Swimmers will work on bobbing, retrieving submerged objects, front and back glides, combined, alternating and simultaneous arm and leg actions on the front and back all with assistance.

## **Level 2 - Fundamental Aquatic Skills**

### **Age 6 and up**

Basic swim skills and safety skills will be performed without assistance in the big pool. Swimmers will work on submerging, front and back glides, combined, alternating and simultaneous arm and leg actions on the front and back without assistance. Swimmers must be able to perform the exit skill of swimming on their front for 5 body lengths, rolling to their back, floating for 15 seconds, rolling to their front and then continue swimming for 5 body lengths in order to move on to Level 3.

## **Level 3 - Stroke Development**

### **Age 7 and up and/or Successful completion of Level 2**

Swimmers will focus on the flutter, scissor, breaststroke and dolphin kicks. They will also focus on increasing their distances of the Front Crawl, Elementary Backstroke and Back Crawl. Diving will also be introduced.

## **Levels 4 -Stroke Improvement**

### **Successful completion of Level 3**

Swimmers should already be able to: swim front and back crawl 25 yards. Swimmers will work on: rotary breathing, freestyle, backstroke, elementary backstroke, scissors kick and sidestroke, whip kick and breaststroke, intro to turning at wall, treading water with modified scissors, and diving in kneeling position.

## **Level 5 - Stroke Refinement**

### **Successful completion of Level 4**

Swimmers should already be able to: swim freestyle, breaststroke and backstroke 25 yards, scissors kick, whip kick, treading water, and dive. Swimmers will work on: alternate breathing, stride jump, refinement of: freestyle, backstroke, elementary backstroke, sidestroke, breaststroke, dolphin kick and butterfly, open turn on front and back, feet-first surface dive, and treading water.

## **Level 6 Swimming & Skill Proficiency**

### **Successful completion of Level 5**

Swimmers should already be able to: swim front and back crawl 50 yds, elementary backstroke 25 yards, breaststroke 25 yards, butterfly 25 yards, sidestroke 10 yards, tread water for 3 minutes, and dive. Swimmers will work on: All six strokes, front and back crawl flip turn, breaststroke turn, breaststroke speed turn and pullout, butterfly turn, sidestroke turn, pike and tuck surface dive, pike and tuck dive from board, tread water for five minutes, and basic water rescue.



### Welcome to 4K: For children 4 to 5 years old

Send your entering-4K student to their very own summer school academic program! We will explore all kinds of crafts, music, nature, and many other activities with this special age group. Breakfast and lunch are served daily without charge. Five-year old children are welcome if they are enrolled in 4K, not regular Kindergarten, for the fall of 2026. It is best that children are toilet trained and able to deal with separation from primary caregivers. Children should bring some type of bag to take projects home, optional sunscreen for recess, a change of clothing, and a plastic bag for soiled clothing, just in case. If your child is in the Early Childhood program, please contact your child's teacher for more details. Class meets at Lien Elementary for three weeks June 15– July 3, 8 am to 12 pm. There is also one two-week section available later in the summer from August 3-14, also at Lien. The curriculum is different in each session.

**Register online. This course is grouped with the Academic Courses.**



### Welcome to Kindergarten: For children entering kindergarten Fall 2026

Help students transition from Preschool to Kindergarten.

- Students tend to forget a lot during the summer.
- Students get bored during the long break of summer.
- Students will review and practice preschool skills.

To help prepare your child for success in kindergarten, we recommend that he/she attend summer school! Session One of Welcome to Kindergarten runs June 15– July 3, Monday through Friday, 8 am - 12 pm.. Session Two runs from August 3-14, Monday through Friday (8:00-12:00). Both sessions will take place at the Lien Elementary.

Critical skills learned in 4K will be reviewed throughout the three-week class in June and the two-week class in August. The curriculum is different in each session. During summer school, children will make projects, sing songs, learn simple finger plays, enjoy recess, and have movement activities. Children should bring some type of bag to take projects home and optional sunscreen for recess. The children will also have breakfast and lunch daily, free of charge.
