

STUDENT DISCIPLINE

Teachers shall have authority over all students in their rooms or assignment areas and those who are unsupervised in corridors. Teachers shall make sure that students under their authority maintain proper conduct.

Teachers should, as much as possible, handle discipline problems themselves. In cases where a student refuses to comply with the teacher's request, the teacher may refer the matter to the building Principal.

Teachers should make their conduct policies clear to students so that students know what is expected of them. Discipline problems should be handled when they arise and not allowed to build up until they become too big to handle. Mass punishment for offenses for which the offenders are not known should not be used.

Specific elementary, intermediate, middle and high school discipline plans shall be established.

The School District of Amery shall not discriminate in standards or rules of behavior or disciplinary measures, including suspensions and expulsions, on the basis of sex, race, color, national origin, ancestry, creed, religion, pregnancy, marital or parental status, sexual orientation, handicap or physical, mental, emotional or learning disability. Discrimination complaints shall be processed in accordance with established procedures.
