ON-LINE REGISTRATION

We are pleased to announce that you are able to *register* for summer school courses online in addition to using the paper forms, which are available by request from the ES, IS, and MS school offices.

The benefit to using the online registration system is that you can see what is available immediately, and you are more likely to get the classes and schedule that you want! Please note: paper forms are sent through inter-office mail and cannot be registered until after the school day. On-line registration is far quicker.

Mission Statement: The purpose of the summer school program in Amery is to provide academic and enrichment opportunities for students during the summer months. The activities in this catalog are for ages 4K through eighth grade. Enrichment summer classes are designed for your child to explore many extended curriculum opportunities not available during the regular school year in a fun and casual environment.

Registration: Registrations will be done online. If you are unable to register online please come to the elementary, intermediate, or middle school office and fill out a registration form.

Deadline: In order to adequately prepare for enrollments, the registration deadline is Friday, April 11th at 9 pm. All classes are available on a first come, first serve basis.

Class Locations: In June, 4K through 3rd grade classes will meet at the Lien Elementary, and 4th through 8th grade classes will meet at the Middle School. In August, Welcome to 4K and Welcome to K will be at Lien, and K-8 classes will be at the Intermediate school. Class locations are subject to change; therefore, check the confirmation letter you will receive in late May to verify class locations.

Transportation: When you register your child, you need to sign him/her up for a specific pick-up and drop-off location if you desire transportation. Students must be picked up and dropped off at the same location. See pages 28-31 for the route pick-up and drop-off locations and times. If you sign your child up for bussing and your plans change on a given day, your child will need a note stating that you will be picking him/her up from school instead of riding the bus. Children being picked up at school by a parent or guardian need to be picked up in their classroom. Children **must** have a note if they are being picked up by someone other than a parent or guardian. **Direct all transportation questions to Mr. Pease, Transportation Director, at 715-268-9771 ext. 231.**

Meals: Breakfast and lunch will be available at no charge for summer school.

Course Fees: *This summer, the Amery School District will be providing for all course supplies, charging no fee to students. Please ensure that students attend all courses for which they register, as supplies are ordered in advance, and there may be a waiting list of students who want to attend.*

Mission Statement

The purpose of the summer school program in Amery is to provide academic and enrichment opportunities for students during the summer months. The activities in this catalog are for ages 4K through eighth grade. Enrichment summer classes are designed for your child to explore many extended curriculum opportunities not available during the regular school year in a fun and casual environment.

Placement of Students

All students enrolled in the School District of Amery are eligible to participate in summer school. Students with disabilities or other impairments are provided reasonable accommodation based on a documented health plan, individual education plan (IEP) or 504 plan. **However, not all services, programs, and supports offered during the regular school year are available at summer school. Parents, who know their children best, may register their children keeping their needs, strengths, and limitations in mind.** The goal of the Amery summer school program is to provide the highest quality education to every student. The proper placement of students is essential to this goal.

Behavior Expectations

The expectations for the behavior of students enrolled in the summer school program mirror those of the school district. We believe in “The Warrior Way.” The expectation is that our students will make the learning environment in summer school a healthy, safe, and caring environment for all students. Students are expected to take responsibility for themselves and for their actions. The core tenets of such behavior are:

Be Safe

Be Respectful

Be Responsible

Children are expected to demonstrate appropriate behavior at all times.

Students may lose privileges if they engage in inappropriate behavior. Behaviors include, but are not exclusive to, abusive language, disruption, defiance, fighting or other physical contact, stealing or damaging property, lying, or bullying will be removed from the summer school environment for the remainder of the day or even from the summer school program permanently.

If a student is removed from the summer school program, they are not allowed to finish the remainder of the day in the Amery Clubhouse program.

Students who engage in behavior which results in their removal from the summer school program for the day will be sent home with their parent or guardian.

Registration Tips

- Welcome to 4K and Welcome to Kindergarten are 8-12 classes. No additional classes are needed during the June or August sessions.
- Choose 2 two-hour classes when attending from 8 am– 12 pm.
- Register for available classes with seats open first. Only join a wait list if your child does not have a registered class at that time. Wait list students are not added to classes if they already have a class on their schedule.
- Academic Reading and Math classes run for three weeks in June and two weeks in August. The material is not repeated. Wait lists are not available for August academics due to a shortage of teachers those weeks.
- Do not register for enrichment classes that are held at the same time as academics. The registration program will not register a child for two classes at the same time.
- Pay close attention to the grade level, based on the grade the student just completed, for each course offering. Registrations for incorrect grade levels will be cancelled.
- Please ensure that your child attends each class for which s/he is registered. Supplies are purchased and teaching contracts are offered based on registration. “Drop-outs” and “no-shows” are unnecessary costs to the school district.
- Out-of-district students who are not open-enrolled in Amery may register for enrichment and/or academic courses from April 7-11.

* **July Dates:** July 7-31, Monday through Friday from 6:00 a.m.—6:00 p.m. at Lien Elementary/ The Clubhouse (**CLOSED June 30-July 4**)

* **August Dates:** August 1-22, Monday through Friday 6:00 am-6:00pm at Lien Elementary/ The Clubhouse (**CLOSED August 25-29**)



- * Children spend time enjoying the outdoor playgrounds, inflatable water slide, nature trails, gym, computer labs, biking, public library and other wonderful resources around school and around town.
- * Staffed by licensed or certified child care providers alongside adults with current First Aid and CPR training and high school assistants.
- * Breakfast and lunch will be provided at school each day through the summer.
- * Each week will include a variety of active recreation & quiet games, arts & crafts, reading, free time, and a special weekly activity.
- * Clubhouse Summer Day camp will also participate in 3 or 4 field trips (yet to be determined).
- * Polk County recognizes this program as a Wisconsin Shares reimbursable child care provider site.

Clubhouse Summer Day Camp Fees

\$30 per day + \$5 weekly activity fee

Full-time Family discount for 1+ child = \$5/day for each add'l child enrolled in the Summer Day Camp.

If you are new to the Clubhouse program please go on the Amery School District website and find the Clubhouse link. Click on that which will bring you to the Clubhouse's homepage. Once in there, there is an icon on the upper right corner that says register, click there and that will bring you to our waitlist.

Enrollments will be accepted beginning March 15 and will continue until April 15 or we reach capacity.

Swimming lessons will be offered through the Amery Summer School program at the New Richmond Area Centre. **Participants must have completed first grade.** Students will be divided into two groups, rotating between a 40 minute lesson and a 40 minute Summer Fun and Fitness, a supervised activity period, when students can enjoy the Centre’s splash pad and outdoor activities. Due to the number of students who register but do not attend all of their lessons, billing for the district has changed, lesson– fee payment will be required at the time of registration, \$24.75 for lessons and electronic processing.

Dates: Aug 4-7 and 11-14 **Time:** 1:00—2:30 PM **Fee:** \$24– non-refundable

Pre-registration is necessary! If you have any questions, please e-mail Mrs. Laura Sjogren at sjogrenl@amerysd.k12.wi.us. Transportation will be available at two specific pick-up and drop-off locations (see below). **Please note: if your child is riding school transportation and his/her discipline becomes a problem, your child will not be allowed to ride the bus.** You will be required to transport your child to New Richmond and remain to supervise if you want your child to finish his/her lessons. If you are transporting your child for lessons, please have your child to the New Richmond Area Centre by 12:50 PM and remain with your child until the Amery swim supervisor arrives. Pick your child up no later than 2:30 PM. **Lunch is available at school for students before the swim bus departs at 12:20.**

Centre Swim Level 1

Participants will learn basic swim skills including body position, blowing bubbles, floating, kicking and freestyle arm strokes in a safe and positive environment. Prerequisites:

Centre Swim Level 2

Participants will continue development of freestyle and elementary backstroke while developing their backstroke, and streamlining. It is common for participants to retake Level 2 to ensure readiness for Level 3. Prerequisites: face in the water, 10 comfortable bobs unassisted, 4 freestyle arm strokes unassisted, 10 second front and back floats unassisted, 4 elementary backstroke strokes, unassisted.

Centre Swim Level 3

Participants will continue development of freestyle and backstroke. Breaststroke kick, dives and treading water are introduced at this level. It is common for participants to retake Level 3 to ensure readiness for Level 4. Prerequisites: 12 yards freestyle with rotary breathing.

Centre Swim Level 4

Participants continue to develop freestyle and backstroke endurance. Breaststroke, sidestroke, and butterfly kick are introduced at this level. It is common for participants to retake Level 4 to ensure readiness for Level 5. Prerequisites: 25 yards freestyle with rotary breathing, 25 yards backstroke, 10 yards breaststroke kick, and 1 minute of treading water.

Centre Swim Level 5

Participants focus on building their endurance in all strokes. Butterfly is taught in this level. Prerequisites: 50 yards freestyle, 50 yards backstroke, 12 yards breaststroke, 12 yards butterfly kick, and 2 minutes of treading water.

Centre Swim Level 6

Participants will continue their focus on endurance in all swim strokes. Proper turns are introduced at this level. Prerequisites: 100 yards freestyle, 100 yards backstroke, 50 yards breaststroke, 25 yards elementary backstroke, 25 yards side stroke, 12 yards butterfly swim.

For children 4 to 5 years old!

Send your entering-4K student to their very own summer school academic program! We will explore all kinds of crafts, music, nature, and many other activities with this special age group. Five-year old children are welcome if they are enrolled in 4K, not regular Kindergarten, for the fall of 2025. It is best that children are toilet trained and able to deal with separation from primary caregivers. Children should bring some type of bag to take projects home. If your child is in the Early Childhood program, please contact your child's teacher for more details. Class meets at Lien Elementary for three weeks June 16– July 3, 8 am to 12 pm. There is also one two-week section available later in the summer from August 4-15, also at Lien. The curriculum is different in each session.

Welcome to Kindergarten!

Welcome to Kindergarten is held at the Lien Elementary for students entering kindergarten the fall of 2025. The purpose of this class is to help students transition from Preschool to Kindergarten.

- ⦿ Students tend to forget a lot during the summer.
- ⦿ Students get bored during the long break of summer.
- ⦿ Students will review and practice preschool skills.



To help prepare your child for success in kindergarten, we recommend that he/she attend summer school!

Session One of Welcome to Kindergarten runs June 16– July 3, Monday through Friday, ending on Thursday, July 3(8:00-12:00). **Session Two** runs from August 4-15, Monday through Friday (8:00-12:00). **Both sessions will take place at the Lien Elementary.**

Critical skills learned in 4K will be reviewed throughout the three-week class in June and the two-week class in August. The curriculum is different in each session. During summer school, children will make projects, sing songs, learn simple finger plays, enjoy recess, and have movement activities. The children will also have breakfast and lunch daily.

Complete the registration and return it to the elementary school office or register online by April 11th. To enroll your child in June Welcome to Kindergarten the course code is **SKJ**. August Summer Kindergarten's code is **SKA**.
