State revenue has not kept pace with the level of inflation for the last decade. After years of budget cuts, the Board of Education has decided it is time!

Amery students rank #2 of 39 local school districts in CESA #11. We want to continue to offer our students the education that others seek to achieve.

Well-maintained facilities are vital, but due to budget cuts, there are deferred maintenance projects to address. Proper care of our facilities saves money.

Due to a current drop in our debt levy, passing this referendum will NOT increase the school portion of your taxes.

Q & A

What if projections are incorrect and spending \$1.9 million would result in a tax increase?

The Board of Education has made a commitment that school taxes will not increase as a result.

What if the referendum fails?

A failed referendum will reduce student opportunities, curriculum and resources, and student technology. A failed referendum will also result in additonal significant cuts to satisfy the projected \$800,000 budget deficit.

Does the referendum include a swimming pool, additions or new buildings?

No. There are no plans for a swimming pool, building additions or new buildings in this referendum.
